



APT Meeting Minutes - February 18th 9:15am – 10:30am

Guest Speaker: Mr. Michael Simeck, Superintendent of Districts 67 and 115

- Mr. Simeck is in the midst of four meetings at the various elementary schools (and an evening time) to gather additional feedback regarding the pending changes to the World Language Program. Yesterday's meeting was held at Sheridan. Mr. Simeck stated that District 67 will continue its strong commitment to a foreign language program. The upcoming changes are expected to be communicated in final form within the next few months and will be implemented for the 2015 – 2016 school year.
- There will be a space utilization study performed at Sheridan in the coming months to assess how to better utilize some of the large spaces (IRC, computer lab) in conjunction with Sheridan's current number of students.
- The results from the District's Climate Survey have just been received and will be distributed in the next week or so. This study was important as one of the messages that came out of the District-wide mission statement project was that students' emotional wellness and social well-being are valued with a similar priority as academics. This report contains a multitude of data pertaining to the emotional climate at the District schools. Mr. Simeck anticipates coming away with a few areas where positive changes can be implemented.
- The author of Mindset, Dr. Carol Dweck, will be presenting to District 67 as well as members of the community and staff on August 21st. More details on school wide discussions to follow, but all are encouraged to read this book.
- PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) testing is starting in the coming weeks across the District. This is a new test mandated by the State of Illinois replacing another student assessment that is no longer required. This is the first year of the District's participation. Mr. Simeck believes this test is positive in that it is linked to the student's curriculum and, therefore, can provide valuable data. However, Mr. Simeck believes a downside to the PARCC is the length of time it takes the students away from learning as the test takes 10-14 hours. This test is for 3rd – 8th grade students. Mr. Simeck stated that it is unclear if Illinois will remain part of the PARCC consortium in future years given these and other limitations.
- This has been another challenging winter weather-wise and Mr. Simeck is very sensitive to the difficulty parents face when there is no school because of cold or snow. The decision to close the schools takes into account many factors. One of the primary concerns is if there was a need to evacuate the students (e.g. anything from a child inadvertently pulling the fire alarm to a real fire), the time it takes the students to walk to a place of safety could be potential harmful in frigid weather. This is not as much of an issue for Sheridan students as they could walk to LFHS. However, it would take the Cherokee students well over 15 minutes to evacuate to their safety destination, Lake Forest Country Day School. The Administration is considering various alternatives and always attempts to keep the students in school as long as it is safely feasible.

Principal's Report: Dr. Michelle Shinn

- Dr. Shinn explained why there was a fully day off for the recent blizzard instead of a late start day. The students need to be at school at least 5 hours for a day to count as a full school day. If there was a late start day on a Monday early release day, the students would not be at school for this 5 hour requirement. There is a lot of thought and discussion that goes into deciding not to have school due to severe weather conditions. Teachers and staff are also disappointed with the number of these days we have had the last few years as it causes disruption to students normal weekly routines.
- Thank you to the Winter Carnival Committee and Emotional Wellness Committee for organizing a great, new theme in the upcoming Winter Carnival! There is a lot of excitement and school spirit generated in anticipation of this event. Dr. Shinn has even volunteered to have a pie thrown at her in the Pie Throwing Contest!
- Dr. Shinn has filled Mrs. Miyamoto's maternity leave position with an internal candidate. There will be an announcement shortly and a parent meeting to discuss the transition.
- Dr. Shinn explained that Sheridan has its own type of "inspiration block" that is less formal than at Cherokee, but just as productive. Sheridan has collaborations happening on-going throughout the school. One example taking place today was the science, music and art teachers collaborating in learning about sound waves. The students actually make and decorate their own musical instrument as part of the project, which happens simultaneously as part of all three subjects (e.g. music, art and science). Sheridan's motto is "We inspire students all day long (not just during a block)!"
- As Mr. Simeck mentioned, PARCC testing will be starting. There is some class time being devoted to preparation as this test is all computer-based and utilizes some concepts, such as window-within-window, highlight/copy/past, etc., that the students have not historically been exposed to. This is the first year of the test, so the data will form a base line to be used in future years for comparison. The Administration has talked with other schools that began taking PARCC last year to gain insights on what to expect.
- Please send your child(ren) to school dressed appropriately for the weather. If the students need to be evacuated for any reason, they would be going out into potentially frigid weather. Please do not send students wearing shorts during these cold months.
