Guest Speakers: Beck Nagel and Kate Rother – FACETS International Children’s Film Festival at Gorton Community Center

- Gorton recently completed a major renovation prompted by the generous \$2 million donation from the Hughes Family for a state-of-the-art new theater among other enhancements to the building. A new entrance at Gorton leads a visitor into a stunning 309-seat theater with new technology systems including sound, project and lights. Lake Forest now has one of the top three theaters in the Midwest.
- One of the first events to be held at the new theater will be the FACETS International Children’s Film Festival to be held on Sunday Oct. 25th. The films have yet to be announced, but will be split by age group including: 7 years and under 1-2pm; 8-11 years old 3-4:40pm; and high school 5-7pm. Gorton is also sponsoring an OutReach program whereby children from North Chicago who might not otherwise have a chance to view these films will be bussed to Gorton for another showing. APT President Report: Kate Rother

- Mr. Simeck, District 67 superintendent, began a recent presentation by distributing Petoskey stones along with a cups of water. Mr. Simeck explained that Petoskey stones look very dull and plain when they are dry and show no distinguishing characteristic. However, Petoskey stones remind us that things are not always as they appear. When a Petsokey stone is immersed in water or polished, beautiful designs emerge, revealing fossilized coral that can only be found in a unique area of upper Michigan. In this way, people are the same as Petoskey stones. It often takes a certain person to interact with us to reveal our unseen talents. That’s why education is so important. The best educators are able to see hidden qualities in students.
- The schedule for APT speakers for the year currently includes: November 18 – Barry Rodgers; January 20 – Susan Milsk; February 17 – Mike Simeck; March 9 – entire District 67 APT meeting at CROYA (speaker TBD); April 20 – OPEN; May 18 – Old Board / New Board Luncheon.
- APT meetings will continue to have student presenters similar to 2015. However, the class scheduled to present today had an unexpected conflict. Please look for details prior to the meetings as to what class will be presenting to the APT.

Principal’s Report: Dr. Michelle Shinn

- The school’s summer renovation is complete and being enjoyed by all. As part of the renovation class/grade locations were moved in order to create the opportunity for students across grades to

get to know each other and have more interactions together.

- A new subject this year for grades 3 and 4 is “Empower Hour,” which is held for 1 hour each week for each respective grade. During this hour several specialist teachers including art, music, science, and IT (in addition to the grade level teachers) come together and each work with a small subset of students from the grade. It is a Self Organized Learning Environment (SOLE) whereby the students are guided by a general, open-ended question and then work as a team to explore answers. Many of these answers are posted along the halls of Sheridan. Additionally, Mrs. Gross has hung a large piece of paper along the library wall where students can write potential questions at any time to be explored in the future.
- Sheridan’s former IRC also has a new name, the “Light Bulb Lab”, and has been redesigned to allow for more opportunities for students. This includes a “maker-space” for designing, building, and creating things. Since this space is dedicated for this use, students do not have to take their projects down, but can leave them up to be continued at another time and for other students to add to them. A letter will be going home to parents requesting any supplies that parents might want to donate to help keep this space stocked.
- Students in grades 2-4 will begin taking the NWEA Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) on Tuesday, September 15th and Thursday September 17th. Students take the MAP reading and math tests in the Fall and Spring every year. They are computerized tests that take approximately 1 hour per subject.
- Sheridan’s sound and video system in the gym is in the process of being updated. This should be completed in the next few months and will be a welcome addition by all.
- The lunch process is still being worked out in terms of schedules and staff getting to know the students for each shift. Parent lunch duty volunteers are expected to be started again by the beginning of October. Please note that the position might look a little different when it is re-launched. Look out for information in the Friday Flyer and from the APT related to the new start date and details.
- Sheridan is launching a house system this year whereby the entire student body will be divided into four mixed-grade level houses. The students in each house will vote on a house name from a list of various sharks (in keeping with the Sheridan Shark theme) and have a house color. This initiative will be announced to the student at the Sharing Assembly to be held on Friday September 18th. Teacher and staff mentor will oversee the various houses. The goal is to have students interact across grade levels more purposefully and participate in activities together that support the 4 District 67 character traits of: teamwork, caring, honest/integrity, and respect.
- Sheridan will hold an Exploration Day on Friday Nov. 13th from 9am - 10:30am during which members of the community/parents will lead cross-grade level groups of students in interesting and unique topics for a 20 minute session. Students will attend three sessions during this event. More info to come!

 - *Sandwich Board* – Please submit a request to use the Spirit and APT sandwich board to Suzanne as far in advance as possible as there is a process to reserve these that she must complete. For district-wide events, the APT Exec Board Reps will likely reserve all three elementary school’s sandwich board, so check with these reps first. Suzanne is available and happy to help create sandwich board posters. The process of creating and printing can take 2-3 weeks as the APT tries to avoid paying rush fees.
